JOB PURPOSE

To support teaching and learning across the school by working independently and alongside teachers to deliver high-quality educational experiences. The postholder will take a lead role in the planning, organisation, delivery, and development of outdoor learning opportunities, ensuring that pupils benefit from engaging, inclusive, and curriculum-linked experiences in outdoor environments.

DESIGNATION OF POST AND POSITION WITHIN SCHOOL STRUCTURE

Responsible to the Headteacher and Senior Leadership Team.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Plan, prepare and deliver learning to individuals, small groups and/or classes modifying and adapting activities as necessary under the direction and supervision of a teacher
- Lead whole-class learning when teachers are absent or engaged in planning, preparation and assessment time (PPA)
- Assess, record and report on development, progress and attainment
- Use teaching and learning objectives to plan, evaluate and adjust lessons/work plans as appropriate within agreed systems of supervision
- Liaise with staff and other relevant professionals and provide information about pupils as appropriate
- Assess the needs of pupils and use detailed knowledge and specialist skills to support pupils' learning
- Support pupils in social and emotional well-being, reporting problems to the teacher as appropriate

Teaching Assistants at this level are expected to undertake at least one of the following:

- a. Provide specialist support to pupils with learning, behavioural, communication, social, sensory or physical difficulties
- b. Provide specialist support to pupils where English is not their first language
- c. Provide specialist support to gifted and talented pupils
- d. Provide specialist support to all pupils in a particular learning area (e.g. ICT, literacy, numeracy, National Curriculum subject).**

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Outdoor Learning Lead Responsibilities

- Lead the development and delivery of a high-quality outdoor learning programme across the school.
- Plan and deliver regular outdoor learning sessions that support curriculum objectives and enhance pupil engagement, both with whole classes but also
- Develop opportunities for learning in the school grounds and local environment.
- Support teachers in incorporating outdoor learning approaches into their curriculum planning.
- Promote environmental education, sustainability, and appreciation of the natural world.
- Organise outdoor learning resources and ensure they are maintained effectively.
- Coordinate seasonal projects, outdoor enrichment activities, and environmental initiatives.
- Support educational visits and residential experiences where required.
- Ensure outdoor learning activities are inclusive and accessible to all pupils.
- Maintain records of outdoor learning participation and impact.
- Work with community organisations, local partners, and environmental groups to enrich outdoor learning opportunities.

Higher Level Teaching Assistants may also:

- Develop and implement Individual Development Plans for pupils (such as Individual Educational Plans), including attendance at, and contribution to, reviews
- Support the role of parents / carers in pupils' learning and contribute to meetings with parents / carers to provide constructive feedback on pupil progress/achievement etc
- Contribute to the development of policies and procedures
- Provide short- term cover supervision of classes
- Manage the work and development of other classroom support staff
- Be responsible for the preparation, maintenance and control of stocks of materials and resources
- Liaise with external agencies on a regular basis
- Provide pastoral care to pupils for example as head of year or tutor group
- Be responsible for pupils who are not working to the normal timetable
- Assist pupils with eating, dressing and hygiene, as required, whilst encouraging independence
- Be responsible for the presentation of displays.

Such other duties as may from time to time be necessary, compatible with the nature of the post.
